Dear Employees, Families and Friends of Ability Works,

Our partner Aurecon also developed a video on the work they have done with Ability Works employees on Inclusive Design / User Centred Design on Melbourne's Tram Stops. Starring in this video are two of Ability Works employees Terry and Mark. Our employees helped Aurecon uncover the need for shelter and safe places for wheelchair users at tram stops. They recommended that braille and handrails be designed in more dynamic colours so they stand out from regular infrastructure, so people with low vision can locate traffic hazards more easily. Terry, who is vision impaired, said he taps surfaces to get around the city. This indicated to Aurecon that sound could be used more effectively when designing. The inputs provided by our employees were not only unique and insightful but demonstrated how vital their input is in the design process.

The Dept of Jobs, Precincts and Regions has awarded Ability Works a Social Enterprise Support Grant to purchase plant, machinery, or equipment of up to \$50,000 to enable us to grow, increase capacity, employ additional staff and/or deliver greater impact. As a result, we will be able to purchase an electric forklift. This will enable more employees to be trained on forklift driving, as it will be much easier to use than our existing ancient forklift.

The Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation has awarded Ability Works a \$50,000 Seed Innovation grant. We had to put forward a new service, concept, or idea that we are developing. The idea we put forward is our Inclusive Design Consulting Service and requested funds to conduct further research to develop this service. This grant will help devise the most appropriate services to deliver to market.

and Safety. Tony has great plans for change, including the formation of a special committee made up of staff and employees who will help us maintain an environment of outstanding health and safety.



## Packing & Reworking

#### P&R June News

Recently we have won a longer term project for Vitaco who supply health snacks to Costco. The ongoing work will be here for 6 to 8 months and involves the packaging of 4 x flavoured snacks into a multipack. With the high volume of work required to meet this customer's needs we have setup a more permanent semi automatic assembly line which will provide employment for 10 to 12 people and possibly more for 4 days per week, continuously. This would not be possible without the P&R teams effort for making space in the front store, setting up the assembly line and getting the line up and running at short notice. Also the Manufacturing team for clearing out old machinery and discarding unwanted items to make temporary space for other P&R goods downstairs as well as the support staff for providing support and assisting with assembly work. We also wanted to thank the employees for their contributions to make the line run smoothly. We have processed the first 44 pallets on time.





are all looking forward to the final reveal of what many years of trial, error and experience has led him to create.










